Waitangi Day Tuesday 6th February

Waitangi Day is the day the Treaty of Waitangi was signed in 1840, in Waitangi, Northland, by representatives of the British Crown and over 500 Māori Chiefs. It is the foundation document of Aotearoa, New Zealand and each signing was followed by a handshake and greeting, 'He iwi tahi tatou' – we are now one people.
